| Bǎoshān | 宝山 | District in northeast Shanghai |
| Cáo Rǔlín | 曹汝霖 | 1877-1966, Signer of the 21 Demands (Yuan Shikai told him to) |
| Duàn Qírui | 段祺瑞 | 1865-1936, Chinese warlord and multiple times the Premier of the Republic of China |
| Guāngxù Emperor | 光绪帝 | Reigned 1875-1908, second to the last Qing Emperor |
| Gù Wéijūn | 顧維鈞 | V.K. Wellington Koo 1888-1985 |
| I.M. Pei | 贝聿铭 | The great Chinese-American architect, born 1917 |
| Jiāding | 嘉定 | District in northeast Shanghai |
| Jiāotōng Yínháng | 交通銀行 | The Bank of Communications |
| Jiāozhōu | 胶州 | The area that is called Qingdao today |
| Kūnshān | 昆山 | City that borders Jiangsu and Shanghai and Suzhou |
| Lín Yǔtáng | 林语堂 | 1895-1976 Renowned Chinese writer, translator, linguist, philosopher and inventor |
| Lù Zhēngxiāng | 陆征祥 | 1871-1949, Head of the Chinese delegation in Paris, former ambassador to Russia back when the Tsar was in charge. |
| Lǐ Hóngzhāng | 李鴻章 | Late Qing Era politician and diplomat. Signed more than his fair share of unequal treaties |
| Róng Yìrén | 荣毅仁 | 1916-2005, former Vice President of China, known as China's "Red Capitalist" and creator of CITIC |
| Shī Zhàoqī | 施肇基 | Albert Sze Sao-ke, ROC era statesman and diplomat (also first Chinese to graduate from Cornell) |
| Soong Sisters | 宋姐妹 | Ailing, Meiling and Qingling |

| Sun Yat sen | 孙逸仙 | 1866-1925, father of the Republic of China |
| T.V. Soong | 宋子文 | 1894-1971, Brother to the Soong Sisters, all around utility player during the Republican era |
| Táng Shàoyì | 唐绍仪 | 1862-1938, First premier of the Republic of China and early mentor to Wellington Koo |
| Wáng Zhèngtíng | 王正廷 | 1882-1961, CT Wang, Chinese foreign minister, finance minister, Justice minister and a premier to boot |
| Wēihǎiwèi | 威海卫 | City bordering Yantai, leased to Britain from 1898-1930. Also known as Port Edward |
| Yuán Shìkǎi | 袁世凯 | 1859-1916, Chinese military man and government official. President of the ROC in 1912 |
| Yán Huìqīng | 严惠清 | 1877-1950, Weiching Williams Yen, diplomat and premier and president of China during the Republican era |
