PINYIN / TERM	CHINESE	ENGLISH / MEANING
Aìxīn Juéluó	爱新觉罗	The Aishin Gioro clan of the Manchus
Aìxīn Juéluó Xiǎnyú	爱新觉罗顯玗	Princess Xiănyú, Kawashima Yoshiko's birth name
Dàlù Làngrén	大陆浪人	Tairiku Rōnin, "wandering adventurers" who played roles small and large in China during the Japanese occupation
Döngzhēn	东珍	The Courtesy Name of Kawashima Yoshiko
Empress Wănróng	婉容皇后	1906-1946, Empress Consort of Puyi. She lived quite a sad and tragic life
Féng Yùxiáng	冯玉祥	1882-1948, known as The Christian Warlord and The Betraying General. A major figure from the warlord era
Guómínjūn	国民军	National People's Army. Also the name of Feng Yuxiang's Clique
Guāndōng military	关东军	Known popularly as the Kwantung Army, they were part of the Japanese Imperial Army that ran things in China
Guāngxù	光绪	Reigned 1875-1908, second to the last emperor of China. Didn't get to enjoy a terribly happy reign as emperor
Háogé	豪格	Hooge, (1609-1648), son of Hóngtáijí 洪台极, the founder of the Qīng Dynasty
Hè Lì Jī Qún	鹤立鸡群	A Crane among chickens, someone who really stands out
Hóngtáijí	洪台极	1592-1643, 2nd Khan of the Later Jin Dynasty and founder of the Qīng Dynasty
Joan Chen	陈冲	Chinese-American actress famous for many roles including her portrayal of Empress Wanrong in The Last Emperor
John Lone (Zūn Lóng)	尊龙	Great all around entertainer probably most famous for his role in The Last Emperor
Kangxi	康熙	Reigned 1661-1722, the long-reigning fourth emperor of the Qing, and one of the better ones
Kawashima Naniwa	川島浪速	1865-1949, Adoptive father of Kawashima Yoshiko

Kawashima Yoshiko	川岛芳子	1907-1948 Beijing-born Manchu princess of the Aisin Gioro clan.
Lady Zhāng Jiā Shì	张佳氏	Prince Sù's widow, Yoshiko's mother
Lóngyù Huánghòu	隆裕皇后	Knoen as Empress Xiaodingjing, she lived 1868-1913. Later became Empress Dowager Lóngyù, consort to the Guangxu Emperor and adoptive mother of Puyi
Lǚshùnkǒu	旅順口	A historic district of Dalian, known as Port Arthur in the bad old days
Nǔ'ĕrhāchì	努尔哈赤	Nurhaci, (1559-1626) the founder and first khan of the Manchu Later Jīn Dynasty that ran 1616-1636. Father of Hong Taiji
Pŭyí	溥仪	1906-1967, The last emperor of the Qing Dynasty. Also known as the Xuāntŏng Emperor 宣统帝
Qiánlóng	乾隆	Another long-reigning Qing emperor who sat on the Dragon Throne from 1733-1796
Qīng Dynasty	清朝	China's last imperial dynasty (so far). Ran from 1644-1911
Shànqí	善耆	1866-1922, the 10th generation Prince Su. Father of Kawashima Yoshiko
Shùnzhì	顺治	1643-1661, First Qing emperor to reign from the new capital in Beijing
Sù Qīnwáng	肃亲王	A high ranking royal peerage used in China during the Qing
Tiānjìn	天津	Port city about an hour or so away from Beijing
Wú Pèifú	吴佩孚	1862-1938, Succeeded Feng Guozhang as head of the Zhili Clique, also former president of China
Yuán Shìkǎi	袁世凯	1859-1916, Military and government official and first president of the Republic of China. Also called "The First Warlord"
Yōngzhèng	雍正	Qing emperor who reigned 1722-1735
Zhāng Xūn	张勋	1854-1923, Qing loyalist general who attempted to restore the abdicated emperor Puyi in the Manchu Restoration of 1917. He also supported Yuan Shikai during his time as president
Zhāng Zuòlín	张作霖	1875-1928, The Manchurian Warlord, another major warlord in his day
Zì	字	Courtesy name, a name some Chinese took on when they reached adulthood
