| bóshì | 博士 | A doctor of philosophy - Ph.D. |
| Běipíng | 北平 | The name of Beijing during the Republican Period |
| Gu Jingwei | | Professor of Wu Jianxiong who had a major impact on her future physics studies |
| Hú Shì | 胡适 | One of the most influential writers, thinkers and teachers in 20th century Chinese history |
| Jiāngsū | 江苏 | Rich coastal province north of Zhejiang |
| Liúhé | 浏河镇 | Town located in Taicang County, where Wu Jianxiong was born |
| Lǐ Zhèngdào | 李政道 | T.D. Lee, Tsung-Dao Lee, born 1926, great Chinese-American physicist and Nobel Prize winner |
| Míngdé Xiǎoxué | 太仓市明德小学 | Míngdé Vocational Continuing School for Girls, where Wu Jianxiong attended school. It was founded by her father Wu Zhongyi |
| Nánjīng | 南京 | Former capital of the Republic of China and of Jiangsu province. |
| qípáo | 旗袍 | A kind of Chinese dress, also known as a Cheongsam (长衫) |
| Shanghai Gōngxué | 上海公学 | The Shanghai Public School |
| Sūzhōu | 苏州 | City in Jiangsu right near Shanghai1 |
| Tiānjìn | 天津 | Port city just one hour east of Beijing |
| Tàicāng | 太仓 | City adjacent to Shanghai and Suzhou, today part of Suzhou |
| Wú Jiànxióng | 吴健雄 | 1912-1997, American physicist and proponent for women's rights |
| Wú Jiànxióng Jìniàn Guǎn | 吴健雄纪念馆 | Jiànxióng Wu Memorial Hall located on the campus of Southeast University in Nanjing |

| Wú Zhòngyì | 吴仲裔 | Wu Jianxiong's father |

| Yangzi River | 扬子江/长江 | The second longest river in the world, known in China as the Chang Jiang |
| Yuán Jiāliú | 袁家騮 | Luke Yuán, grandson of Yuan Shikai and husband of C.S. Wu. |
| Yáng Zhènníng | 楊振寧 | C.N. Yang, Chen-Ning Yang, b. 1922, along with colleague T.D. Lee, one of the greatest physicists of the 20th centuryChinese American or otherwise |
